

Information for providing written reports

The first time you send us information we would like to know about your philosophy: In other words what approach you will be using and who is involved in educating your child(ren), e.g. specialist tutors, other family members/adults.

In the first report and any subsequent reports it is helpful to include:

- The subjects/topics covered during the year
- Any specific achievements
- Any areas where your child is progressing well or less well.
- main resources used to support learning. These can include books, computer software, library, TV programmes, specialist equipment
- Opportunities for social Interaction. This could include membership of organised groups, or the local Home Education support network
- Examples of work to demonstrate progress
- A list of experiences your child has had over the last twelve months or copies of any syllabus or plans used together with the experiences gained from them.

By including this information it enables LA Officers to understand the provision made for the child/ren and demonstrates the progress made by your child/ren
