NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF A PREMISES

Notice is given that Sunderland Association Football Club Limited has applied to Sunderland City Council to vary a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

The proposed variations to the Premises Licence are:

- To provide an updated plan of the premises to incorporate the new bar on the ground level in the West Stand. This area is already covered for licensable activities and we anticipate that this will serve current guests who upgrade to be in the bar so there will be no increase in capacity. There will be no change to licensable activities or the timings of the activities already in force.
- Removal of restrictions regarding of the fixture on TVs around the concourse, specifically:
 - The second part of Annex 2, 1), a) i) the sale and consumption of alcohol will commence no earlier than two hours immediately preceding the commencement of the match or the event, however we will leave TVs turned off to discourage supporters from remaining on the concourse during play.
 - Annex 2, 2) Television screens on the Concourse must be turned off at the commencement of the second half and remain turned off until ten minutes before the end of normal time (90 minutes).
