NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR MINOR VARIATION OF A  
PREMISES LICENCE

Notice is given that Kenneth Craigs has applied to Sunderland City Council to vary a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

The proposed variations to the Premises Licence are:

- To reduce the hours for licensable activities to 11:00 – 01:30 on Fridays and Saturdays.
- Dress code to be implemented from 19:00 on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.
- Premises will operate a 'clicker' system to monitor capacity levels.
- Premises licence holder will implement a dispersals policy, including a wind down period during the last 30 minutes of opening, when music is to be played at a lower volume.
- Premises will provide 'walkie talkies' or other communication devices to essential staff throughout the venue on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.
- Amend condition relating to door staff to have two SIA door supervisors from 19:00 until close on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.
- Amend condition relating to persons entering / leaving premises to state no person shall be admitted to leave whilst in possession of driving vessel, this can only be in a plastic drinking vessel.
- Amend condition relating to children to state they must be always accompanied by an adult and leave the premises by 19:00
- An outside management plan must be in place which includes the following
  - Any drinks consumed in the outside area must be served only in containers made of strengthened glass or plastic
  - Ensure staff regularly patrol outside the premises and suitable signage is displayed to respect amenities of residents.
