The state of digital inclusion in the UK charity sector

Recently, Charity Digital launched a survey to understand more about digital inclusion in the charity sector. The survey revealed: 82% of charities are concerned about digital exclusion; 56% find reaching service users difficult due to problems with technology and 66% struggled to implement digital technologies due to a lack of skills among service users.
